Minutes of Regular Meeting January 17, 2017

The Mayor and Town Council met in regular session on Tuesday, January 17, 2017 at 7:00PM, at the Lockport Town Hall Complex.

A. Call to Order, B. Opening Prayer, C. Pledge of Allegiance

Mayor Edward Reinhardt called the meeting to order. The opening prayer was offered by Mandy Himel. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Reinhardt.

D. Roll Call

The roll was called with the following present: Mayor Edward Reinhardt, Councilmembers Stephen Baudoin, Sharon Guidry, Bobbie M. Galjour, Rodney Hartman, and Wayne Bourgeois, Jr. Also present were Mandy Himel Town Clerk, Town Attorney Chris Huddleston, Chief of Police Warren Vedros, Bryan Adams, Scott John Guidry, Denise Chiasson, Floyd Cretini, Wayne Galjour, Craig Rogers, Lonnie Dominique, David Hanley, Tom Butler, Michelle Gautreaux, Lucy Orgeron, Richard J. Boquet, Ron J. Sapia, Victor Blanchard, Barry Plaisance, Mr. and Mrs. Mark Rodriguez, Buck Hebert, Mary Lynn Blanchard, and Allie Rasid, Jr.

E. Approval of Minutes for December 20, 2016, Regular Meeting

Mayor Reinhardt asked for approval of the minutes for December 20, 2016. Councilman Hartman stated public wishing to address the Council was omitted. The section to be added stated M. Public wishing to address the Council. Mr. Bryan Adams asked the Town Council what he had to do to start the process of putting an ice vending machine on his property at 413 Canal Street. The property is zoned residential at this time, and he would like to rezone it commercial. Councilman Rogers stated he would have to apply for a permit and a variance, put a sign on the property for the public to know what will be going there, advertise on the property at least two weeks prior to the meeting and have a public hearing at the next meeting. He stated the Council would listen the public input and make a decision to grant a zoning change. Councilman Rogers made a motion to call for public hearing to discuss rezoning of the property at 413 Canal Street at next month's meeting. Councilman Hartman seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously. Mayor Champagne stated we would not be voting on anything tonight. Mr. Paul Terrebonne addressed the Council. He appreciated Mr. Adams asking him about putting an ice machine on the property. He stated they don't want an ice machine in their back yard. They do not want that to be rezoned. He stated Ms. Chaisson had been living in that house for 30 years. She has applied twice to get a trailer put on the lot, and the Council denied it twice. He stated if they rezone that property to commercial it would bring down the property value of the homes in that area. He also stated that if there is a commercial property within 500 feet that homeowners insurance would be denied. He sold insurance for years. He wanted them to consider all of these things. Mayor Champagne stated he will have to come back next month for Public hearing. He stated he would come back next month. Councilman Triche stated a public hearing is for public to address the Council on the topic. Councilwoman Guidry made a motion to approve the minutes as amended. Councilman Hartman seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

F. Approval of Minutes for December 27, 2016, Special Meeting

Mayor Reinhardt asked for approval of the minutes for December 27, 2016 special meeting. Councilman Hartman moved and Councilman Bourgeois seconded a motion to approve the minutes as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

G Approval of Financial Statements for the month ending December 31, 2016

Mayor Reinhardt asked if there were any questions or comments concerning the financial statements for the month ending December 31, 2016. Councilman Hartman moved and Councilman Baudoin seconded a motion to approve the financial statements as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

H. Lockport Carnival Club

Mr. Victor Blanchard, President of the Lockport Carnival Club, asked the Council for permission for the Krewe of Apollo parade to roll through Town on February 25 at Noon. He stated we don't have a King or Queen this year. They do have a Grand Marshall, Andrew Zeringue. Councilman Bourgeois made a motion to allow the Carnival Club to roll that day. Councilman Baudoin seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously. Councilman Bourgeois asked if there was anything else they needed from the Town. Councilman Bourgeois made a motion to continue to do the toasting and celebration in the morning for the Grand Marshall this year at Town hall. Councilwoman Guidry seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

I. Police Report

Mayor Reinhardt called on Police Chief Warren Vedros to report on his department's activities. Chief Vedros distributed copies of the monthly activity report. Councilwoman Guidry thanked Chief Vedros. She made a request a couple months back on the dates as to how he put it into a report. She appreciates him making the

change to show a full month of the reports. A motion was made by Councilman Bourgeois and seconded by Councilwoman Galjour to accept the Police Report as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

J. Providence Report

Mayor Reinhardt called on Clay Breaud of Providence, who gave the monthly engineering status report as follows:

1. **Sewer Rehabilitation (Northwest Quadrant):**
Project is complete. The Town requested that LRWA smoke test the quadrant. We are waiting on them to schedule it.
2. **Sewer Rehabilitation (Southwest Quadrants):**
The project was bid on January 10, 2017. Gulf Coast Underground, LLC (GCU) was the apparent low bidder with a bid of \$1,350,663.40. A resolution is on the agenda to award the contract to GCU once concurrence is obtained from LDEQ.
3. **Street Repairs:**
A State Capital Outlay application was submitted for funds for the construction of asphalt street overlay and repairs. It will be July before we know if the Town was successful in obtaining this money.
4. **Drainage Improvements between Church and School Streets:**
A State Capital Outlay application was submitted for culvert installation in the canal behind the post office and elderly apartments. It will be July before we know if the Town was successful in obtaining this money.

K. Resolution

1. To authorize the Mayor to sign a CEA between the Town of Lockport and volunteers from the IRS's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program to allow for the use of the meeting room of the Town Hall in order to provide free tax preparation services to citizens of Lockport and surrounding community.

Councilman Bourgeois asked if this was the same organization that was doing this at the library. He wanted to know if there was any specific reason why they weren't doing it at the library this year. Ms. Leslie Guidry stated that the person that negotiated with the libraries, and she passed away. So without her, they weren't able to come to the same agreement to be able to utilize the libraries this year. She also stated there were some discrepancies with schedules last year at the library as well. Councilman Bourgeois asked about how many people they help per year. She stated last year she did over 100 in the Lockport Library. He asked if it was just residents of Lockport or anyone in the surrounding areas. She stated they don't turn anyone away. He stated there are a couple of other entities in Town hall who rent from the Town. He asked the Mayor if he saw any conflicts with anything going on at Town Hall. Councilwoman Guidry asked what area they would use. Mayor Reinhardt stated they would use the Meeting Room. Councilman Hartman asked how often they would be here. Ms. Guidry stated they would be here twice a week, and she would get with Mandy on the schedules. Councilman Hartman stated it was a good program. Councilman Bourgeois stated in the contract it read to allow the contracting parties to meet with citizens free of interruption. Town hall is open to the public. He didn't know how much that would affect privacy issues. She stated it shouldn't be an issue.

Councilman Hartman made a motion to authorize the Mayor to sign above stated resolution. Councilman Baudoin seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

L. Appointments for January 1, 2017-December 31, 2020

1. Mayor Pro Temp

Mayor Reinhardt stated he would like to state one thing, and he knows the Council votes on it. He recommended Councilman Hartman. Councilwoman Guidry stated she appreciated it, and she stated Mr. Rodney has been on the Town council. She made a motion to nominate Councilman Bourgeois as Mayor Pro Tem. Councilman Baudoin seconded the motion. All except one were in favor. Councilman Hartman opposed.

2. Town Attorney- Mayor recommended Chris Huddleston

Councilwoman Guidry made a motion to appoint Christopher Huddleston as the Town Attorney/Town Magistrate. Councilman Bourgeois seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously. He would be hired at a rate of \$100 per hour for his services. Councilman Bourgeois made the motion to accept the rate at \$100 per hour. Councilman Hartman seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

3. Town Clerk- Mayor recommended Mandy Himel.

Councilman Bourgeois made a motion to appoint Mandy Himel as Town Clerk. Councilwoman Galjour seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

4. Budget & Financial Affairs- Mayor recommended Councilman Hartman.

Councilman Baudoin made a motion to appoint Councilman Hartman for Budget and Financial Affairs. Councilman Bourgeois seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

5. Streets/Drainage Commissioner

Mayor Reinhardt wanted to appoint himself as the Streets/Drainage Commissioner with the help of Councilwoman Galjour. Councilman Hartman asked if they could appoint him. Councilman Bourgeois stated it just stays with no appointment.

6. Zoning and Planning- Mayor recommended Councilman Bourgeois and Councilman Baudoin

Councilwoman Guidry made a motion to appoint Councilman Bourgeois and Councilman Baudoin. Councilwoman Galjour seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

7. Arts and Civic Beautification- Mayor recommended Councilwoman Guidry.

Councilman Bourgeois made a motion to appoint Councilwoman Guidry. Councilwoman Galjour seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

8. Parks and Recreation- Mayor recommended Councilwoman Galjour.

Councilman Hartman made a motion to appoint Councilwoman Galjour. Councilwoman Guidry seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

Councilman Bourgeois made a motion to go into Public hearing. Councilman Hartman seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

M. Public Hearing

1. AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE COMPREHENSIVE ZONING ORDINANCE AND ZONING DISTRICT MAP FOR THE TOWN OF LOCKPORT, LOUISIANA, TO RE-DESIGNATE CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED AT 413 CANAL ST, CURRENTLY ZONED R-1 RESIDENTIAL, AS PART OF THE C-1 NEIGHBORHOOD COMMERCIAL DISTRICT. (No businesses can be on this property as of now- new ordinance would allow the property to be open to business)

Mr. Paul Terrebonne, 414 Lafourche Street, stated he did a petition of neighbors around Canal Street who are opposing of the rezoning. He stated doing something for an individual won't benefit the Town. He asked questions about the zoning and ordinances in the Town. He is concerned with sound and traffic with the ice machine. He used Frank's Supermarket's ice machine for an example. Councilman Bourgeois stated he lives a block and a half away, and he hears noise from Thomassie Shipyard which is operating 24 hours. He also stated he was given a brochure for the proposed ice machine, and it is not like the one by Frank's Supermarket. Mr. Terrebonne asked about parking, safety, permits, and flooding issues. Councilman Bourgeois asked how the Council would be violating the ordinances. Councilman Bourgeois stated we are trying to pull people in Town to spend money. He asked why Mr. Adams couldn't put the ice machine by his house down Catherine Street on his empty Lot. Mr. Bryan Adams responded that is was about location. Mr. Terrebonne stated there were ethical issues that needs to be addressed amongst themselves. He said two people need to recuse themselves from voting because of conflict of interest. This could bring a lot of investigations in this town based on past and present things. He stated they know who they are. Councilman Bourgeois asked him who he was talking about and why especially if it is an ethical issue. Mr. Terrebonne also asked about a permit being not accepted or not approved for a trailer or mobile home at the time. Councilman Bourgeois stated in definition of the zoning book, R-1 does not allow trailer homes. Councilman Bourgeois stated in the definition of commercial, a dwelling is not allowed, but buildings can be put on the property. He told Councilman Bourgeois that he has been life-long friends with Mr. Bryan Adams. Councilman Bourgeois stated he met him about 4 or 5 years ago, but he appreciates that. Councilman Bourgeois stated he can go either way because you, Mr. Terrebonne, did work for me as well in the past. He also asked Mr. Terrebonne, did or did you not state your plans were to eventually put a bait shop on your property. Mr. Terrebonne stated no. He said what he said was if they approved this, he would apply to get a permit to put a bait shop, ice machine, and everything on his lot. Councilman Bourgeois stated they can agree to disagree. He said that is not the discussion he recalls. This discussion was before the election. Councilman Bourgeois was unaware of the ice machine, and Mr. Terrebonne informed him about it. Mr. Terrebonne stated it was his word against Councilman Bourgeois' word. He even asked him how he would vote on it. Councilman Bourgeois stated it needed to be brought to public meeting at Town hall. Councilman Baudoin asked Mr. Terrebonne about the Ethics of this situation. He stated the ethical aspect would be friendship. Councilman Hartman asked the Mayor to allow other people to address the Council. Councilman Bourgeois asked what concerns he was bringing up that the Council can do something about. He asked if he was bringing up concerns that he is trying to find relevant. Councilman Bourgeois stated then this should go to the Attorney General not the Council. Mr. Terrebonne stated it will go to the Attorney General especially depending on the vote on this ordinance change.

Mr. Barry Plaisance, 121 Catherine Street, stated this is bad for business, and this is the first business that comes up in front of this Council. He stated that one small ice machine would provide more tax dollars than the whole block. There is no favoritism. He will read into the noise ordinance. He said there is no way to separate because it is already done by commercial and residential. Mr. Plaisance stated that Councilman Hartman said sales tax is down. He stated this is an easy way to raise taxes with a simple vote. He stated here is your chance to promote business in Town.

Mr. Mark Rodrigue stated he was in favor of this new business.

Mrs. Margie Black lives near this lot, and she is in favor of this new business. She also had a letter from Sue Sue Bollinger, since she could not attend, stating she was in favor of it as well.

Mr. Craig Rogers offered to verify any zoning questions.

Mr. Weldon Triche, 321 Canal Street, stated zoning was done to better the Town of Lockport. He stated the tax dollars that will be made will be little to none. He is strongly against it.

Mr. Lonnie Dufrene stated he was looking to build rent house in the Town of Lockport. It would bring in tax dollars, but he is not going through all this hassle and fight the public to try to improve Lockport.

Mr. John Wagner, 125 Lafourche Street, stated everyone is educated. They don't need anyone to tell them what to do.

Mayor Reinhardt asked the Public three times if they wanted to address the Council. There were no comments.

Councilman Bourgeois made a motion to go back into Regular Session. Councilwoman Guidry seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

Councilman Baudoin asked what happened after the decision is made or if it is made to make it commercial. He asked will it remain as a commercial location. He wanted to know if they can put a restriction on the lot for a time frame to remain commercial. The Town Attorney stated you would be voting on the ordinance as presented to you right now or you are not adopting it as presented right now. If you want to table this and get more input on this, then you would not adopt this ordinance at this time.

N. Ordinances

1. AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE COMPREHENSIVE ZONING ORDINANCE AND ZONING DISTRICT MAP FOR THE TOWN OF LOCKPORT, LOUISIANA, TO RE-DESIGNATE CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED AT 413 CANAL STREET, CURRENTLY ZONED R-1 RESIDENTIAL, AS PART OF THE C-1 NEIGHBORHOOD COMMERCIAL DISTRICT

Councilman Hartman made a motion to accept the above ordinance. Councilman Bourgeois seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

O. Reports

1. Mayor

Mayor Reinhardt stated the Town Crew is cleaning ditches. He has been making phone calls and finding out information to help the Town.

2. Council

a. Councilman Baudoin is pleased to be with this group. He believes if we share common respect for each other we can work well as a team and get things done for the town. He asked the Town Clerk to briefly talk about the financial statements. Councilman Hartman and Ms. Himel briefly explained the financials to the Council and the Public. Councilman Baudoin recognized the cheerleading group from Lockport Middle School and Central Lafourche High School for placing first in the recent competition. Mayor Reinhardt will send a letter to those schools.

b. Councilwoman Guidry congratulated all the new members and new Mayor. She is looking forward to all working together and working for the people in the Town. She made a suggestion for us to contact Cam Morvant's Office to offer training/refresher for our newly elected officials as well as herself and Councilman Hartman. She also asked the administration for a vendor history report to be included in their packets for the meeting. Councilwoman Guidry asked about the road buy back program. Mayor Reinhardt stated he has a meeting this week with DOTD. Councilman Baudoin asked if the drainage issues on Vacherie would be addressed. Mayor Reinhardt stated he would bring it up to DOTD.

c. Councilwoman Galjour stated she is honored to serve on the Council. She stated she has a lot to learn. She stated the decision she had to make tonight was very difficult for her to make. She listened to everyone who spoke to the Council. She felt she made the best decision for the Town.

d. Councilman Hartman stated he looked forward to working with the Council and Mayor. He stated the Mayor has a lot that he wants to accomplish. He stated we will do what we can to help the Mayor and Council to advance the Town. They are trying to get the funds to purchase a bobcat excavator and tripod. He looks forward to working with everyone.

e. Councilman Bourgeois thanked everyone for coming out, and allowing him to be up here. He also thanked the Council for nominating and voting on him for Mayor Pro Temp. He thanked the Mayor for appointing him on Zoning and Planning. He asked if the public wishing to address the council be moved up on the agenda in the future. He thanked the public for being patient for their first meeting. He stated the flags and lights should be coming down soon depending on the weather. He thanked Lockport Rotary Club and Allstate for the funds for the Christmas decorations. The intent was to start revitalizing the center of the Town by getting business/people to donate funds to purchase more Christmas decorations. He stated to the Mayor there are two seats open for appointees from the Town of Lockport for the Lockport Fair Board. Councilman Hartman made a motion to nominate Councilman Bourgeois as the voting member and Councilwoman Guidry as the alternate member. Councilwoman Galjour seconded the motion, and it carried unanimously.

3. Town Attorney

Mr. Huddleston stated he appreciated the Council appointing him again. He would appreciate if the Council had any questions to call him prior to the meeting so he can be more prepared.

4. Staff

a. Ms. Himel thanked the Mayor and Council for appointing her for Town Clerk for another 4 years. She stated if anyone has any questions about finances or anything else to give her a call at Town Hall.

P. Public wishing to Address the Council

1. Lucy Orgeron, 212 Barataria Street, wants to know why the trustees were digging ditches without proper equipment when they have more important things to do. She thought at one time they were renting a small excavator to do that. She wants to know why the Town can't continue to do that and why not let trustees take down Christmas decorations, etc. Mayor Reinhardt stated the Town Foreman has a list of things they are trying to do. There is change going on at this time. It won't be a regular routine like they did in the past. Mayor Reinhardt stated the backhoe is too big to clean out ditches because we have to worry about hitting lines near the ditch. Mr. Tony Ordoyne, Town Foreman, stated the Town is trying to get a mini excavator because it would be a more convenient with the smaller bucket to dig ditches. The crew has been told to start cleaning ditches. He explained to them if the equipment is purchased he will take care of the equipment.
2. Mr. Barry Plaisance, 121 Catherine Street, stated he was the Chairman of the Lafourche Parish Game and Fish Commission. He feels everyone would benefit with the restoration project in Lake Fields then in Lake Long. He is not asking the Town of Lockport for one dollar. He would like Town of Lockport to co-sponsor to support the Lafourche Parish Game and Fish Commission. He asked about permits. Mayor Reinhardt stated South Central Planning is in charge of permits in the Town. He asked who in Town determines if they need a permit. He stated he sees things going on in Town, and there are no permits. Mayor Reinhardt stated he would ask South Central Planning to come to the meeting to address issues. The Town Foreman is the one in Town who checks for permits and lets them know to come to Town Hall. He asked about Part time workers. Mayor Reinhardt stated he will do whatever he thinks is best for the Town. Mr. Plaisance stated it sounds like he has already changed to part time workers. Mayor Reinhardt stated there is no one part time yet. If he would do that, then it would save money for the town. He stated for him to go down Comeaux Drive and see people with no electricity with no jobs. If he could put them to work part time, that is what he will go after because he is here to help the people. Mr. Plaisance restated his comment because they are working 33 hours which makes them full time. Mayor Reinhardt stated they are keeping their insurance and we have extra money with no over time. He stated this is his decision. Mr. Plaisance asked if he is planning to bring in more part time people. Mayor Reinhardt said he will do whatever will benefit this Town. He will check with Town Attorney before he does anything. He will do whatever it takes to do it.
3. Mr. Mark Rodrigue asked about streets. He feels we might possibly need to look into Road Sales Tax and let the people decide.
4. Janice Savoie, 725 Sixth Street, mentioned to Mayor Champagne at last meeting about the parking on the side of the convenient store on Church Street. She asked if the intention was to make that a one way street. She stated two people can't pass there with the parking and the lines there. Councilman Bourgeois stated we have to keep in mind the same thing will have to go into effect with the school. He isn't sure about putting no parking signs. We have to take into consideration with the school as well. We will contact the funeral home for them to use the parking in the back of the funeral home. Chief Vedros stated the line that are painted should be removed as well.
5. Michelle Gautreaux, 1203 Romy drive, is the Executive Creative Director of Geaux Create. She stated we look forward to change for the Town. The junior board is working on beautification of the schools in the area. She talked about different things the junior board is doing to make a change and a difference.
6. Mr. Jimmy Cantrelle, Parish President, congratulated all the new members. He stated the Parish wants to work with the Town, and they will try to do their best to help.
7. Armand Autin, Parish Councilman, thanked Mr. Cantrelle. He stated about a year ago there was an engine that was out at the Al Robichaux Pump. Mr. Cantrelle did approve for it to be replaced. He stated the boat launch is in the budget to start making improvements.

Q. Adjourn

The next scheduled regular Town meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 21, 2017. There being no further business to come before the Council, a motion by Councilman Bourgeois to adjourn the meeting was seconded by Councilman Baudoin, and it carried unanimously at 9:34 PM.





The following ordinance was introduced by Councilman Hartman in regular session convened on January 17, 2017.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-001

The following ordinance, having been previously introduced, was offered for final adoption by Councilman Hartman , and seconded by Councilman Bourgeois.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE COMPREHENSIVE ZONING ORDINANCE AND ZONING DISTRICT MAP FOR THE TOWN OF LOCKPORT, LOUISIANA, TO RE-DESIGNATE CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED AT 413 CANAL STREET, CURRENTLY ZONED R-1 RESIDENTIAL, AS PART OF THE C-1 NEIGHBORHOOD COMMERCIAL DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the property described above was designated as part of the R-1 Residential District in the Comprehensive Zoning District Map for the Town of Lockport; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council believes it to be in the best interest of the town to re-zone the property

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the property described hereinabove shall be zoned as C-1, neighborhood commercial district, as defined in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Lockport; and the said Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance and Zoning District Map is hereby amended to reflect the C-1 zoning designation.

This Ordinance shall become effective as of signing by the mayor.

This Ordinance, having been submitted in writing, having been read and adopted at a public meeting of said council, was then submitted to an official vote as a whole, the vote thereon being as follows:


